

The Arkansas Department of Education announced changes to the CCDF subsidy program, giving more families access to high-quality child care programs. These changes, which became effective on July 1, can help eligible families balance home and work life and make applying for this assistance easier. # **Academic Approval**

The LEARNS Act requires that each licensed early learning provider receiving public funding shall participate in the "Unified Early Childhood Care and Education System." In order to adhere to this requirement, the Office of Early Childhood (OEC) created academic approval as a way to certify early learning sites are in compliance with this requirement. All early childhood sites that accept public funding are required to participate starting the 2024-2025 academic year. This includes ABC programs, publicly-funded pre-k classrooms, CCDF voucher recipients, Early Head Start/Head Start, and Medicaid (EIDT sites). Licensed early childhood sites that don't accept public funding may opt-in and receive a rating through Better Beginnings. Your licensing specialist will give you resources to certify your participation in academic approval.

Early learning sites participating in academic approval must comply with the following:

- Participation in the local early childhood lead organization and all associated activities
- Participation in Better Beginnings.
