Have you received your flu shot? Last year's flu effects were serious for children of all ages. Whether you're a parent or a provider, preventative action against the flu virus is important to keep your family (or classroom) healthy all flu season long.

Flu vaccines are cited as the best protection against the flu virus. The CDC recommends that children 6 months and older be vaccinated against the flu.

The best time to get your child's flu shot is NOW! It takes a few weeks for the shot to take effect in your child's body, so the sooner they have the shot... the better. Staying home

from school is never fun for a sick kid. Getting the flu shot will help your child continue to learn in their educational environment and participate in their favorite activities throughout the fall and winter months.
