4.	What could I put in the area to spark children's interest in this independent activity? Posters? Photographs? Displays of interesting materials for use in the activity? Posted questions or lists of ideas for getting started? Other items to make the area appealing, comfortable, and visually attractive? "Mood music" related to the activity to draw kids to the area?

5.	What community resources could enhance this activity? (field trips, sites, organizations, experts, speakers, performers, etc.)
6.	Will kids need special materials or a special place to store ongoing work related to this activity?  Notebooks? File boxes? Plastic storage tubs? Designated display shelves? Bulletin boards for kids to display "products" or "news items" related to this activity? Other?
7.	How can I get kids involved in helping create and manage a center for this activity?
8.	What else could I do to create an inviting center for this independent activity?
