

- **1. Water** Children can have so much fun playing they forget to drink enough water. When you bring them in from playing outside, have water ready for them to drink.
- **2. Shade** Encourage children to play in the shade of trees, or create your own shade using sheets or other materials. This will give them added protection from the sun and a cooler place to play.
- **3. Sunscreen** The best way to ensure children are protected from the sun is to cover their exposed skin with sunscreen. This will keep them safe now and reduce the risk of certain diseases as they grow.
- **4. Hats -** Hats are an efficient way to protect faces and necks from the sun. Encourage your client-families to include a hat in their child's backpack each day.


