- 5. Enjoy outdoor time early in the morning when it's cooler.

CLASS Pilot

In case you missed it, the Arkansas Department of Education is piloting CLASS, a new classroom assessment tool that focuses on teacher-child interactions, as called for in the LEARNS Act. Early care and education providers in counties covered by a local lead will participate. Those providers will be invited to provide feedback on the tool and how it can work in Arkansas classrooms.

Starting this summer, all licensed early care and education facilities receiving public funds must participate in the new Academic Approval process. Upon completing this process, facilities agree to participate with their local lead organization and to receive a Better Beginnings star rating.


