

Child Care Assistance Program Update

A Child Care Assistance Program is available for Arkansas early care educators for their children who are enrolled in registered or licensed early childhood programs. If you are an early care and education provider who works for a licensed or registered child care provider with an active CCDF Participant Agreement and have young children, you may be eligible! You can find more information about eligibility in **this letter**.

The application is available in <u>English</u> and <u>Spanish</u> and must be submitted to <u>oec.familysupport@ade.arkansas.gov</u>.



Local Leads

We're thrilled to announce that the <u>second cohort of local early childhood leads</u> has been selected! These 13 organizations represent an additional 36 counties across the state. Alongside cohort 1, local leads now cover 65 of the 75 counties in Arkansas. Local Leads are responsible for establishing a comprehensive, localized plan to ensure children and families can access high-

quality early childhood education in their communities. If you are a provider in one of these counties, you should expect to hear from your new local lead soon!

If you don't fall within a county selected for Cohort 1 or 2, a final cohort will be selected by the fall. That means every county will have a local lead by October 2024.

CLASS Pilot Program

The **LEARNS** Act calls for a "simple, clear, and understandable uniform accountability system...that includes a rating indicative of child outcomes." To fulfill this provision, the Arkansas Department of Education (ADE) is piloting the Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS) tool, in the counties covered by a local lead. The pilot will begin during the 2024-25 school year. **This does not imply changes to Better Beginnings** but is a chance for Arkansas to explore using a tool that focuses on adult-child interactions.

Three benefits of the CLASS tool include:

- It measures the quality of teacher-child interactions.
- It's correlated to educational outcomes for children.
- It's used in classrooms serving children from birth to 3rd grade across the country.

The pilot will include building a pool of observers, providing teachers and leaders with training and feedback, and collecting information on the current quality of early childhood and education classrooms, as measured by CLASS. This is an opportunity for early childhood leaders and programs to become trained in the tool, practice using the tool, and provide information to ADE on how this tool works in classrooms and for children.

These evidence-based, in-depth measures help to inform a consistent definition of early childhood quality, show how well classrooms support children's growth and development, and provide teachers and leaders with actionable information to improve.

Those participating in the CLASS pilot will receive free training on the importance of interactions and ways to achieve the highest quality care in classrooms. Participants will also receive feedback following observations to improve the classroom quality. The pilot class will also have the opportunity to offer feedback to ADE and shape the direction of quality initiatives for children birth-5 in our state.
