# A NOTE FROM DAWN JEFFREY:




Happy February! This month, our LOVE for READING is in the air.

Share your favorite story by reading aloud to your classroom or sing songs in the classroom. These activities encourage children to use their imaginations at a young age.   - What materials and equipment were used?
  - How much teacher-child interaction was there?
  - What did you notice about the child's learning?
- 2.) Watch the video a second time with ONE topic in mind. (materials, interactions, etc.)
  - Note the new details you observed.
- 3.) How can you apply this to your classroom?
  - Do you need to create a Dramatic Play Center?
  - What can you do to improve yours?

4.) Set a goal for your Dramatic Play Center.
