A few more reasons to celebrate YOU!

 Ten Arkansas Better Beginnings child care providers in Washington County and Benton County are pursuing accreditation from the National Association for Family Childcare (NAFCC) in a pilot program supported by the University of Arkansas Early Care and Education Projects, Family Child Care Network.



- Better Beginnings providers are trained to provide quality care for children ages **Zero to five**, helping Arkansas parents return to work when their child is as young as **four months old**.
- Better Beginnings providers spend roughly 11,500 hours with Arkansas children before kindergarten.



• **85%** of of a child's personality, social skills and intellect are developed by **age 5**, so Better Beginnings providers are trained to support the development of social and academic skills throughout a child's lifetime.



SHAMANDA NELSON--MINERAL SPRINGS ABC PRESCHOOL

Shamanda Nelson, who has been teaching for **19 years**, is a Director and Teacher at **Mineral Springs ABC Preschool in Mineral Springs**. In her free time, you can find Shamanda volunteering at the Harvest Food Program, Feeding Under the Bridge Program and 4-H.

"It's a gift from God, because each day I pray that God would give me wisdom, knowledge and understanding to meet the needs of these babies," Shamanda said. "I would love to see students being more motivated about school, learning and being better citizens in the community."





BRANDI BURTON--THE ALLEN SCHOOL


